German Public Law & the German Constitutional System

To provide an opportunity to gain comprehensive, cutting-edge knowledge in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, CPG's Academy on the German Public Law & the German Constitutional System is going online. Germany – one of the central European powers – is known for a public law of remarkable quality and differentiation that has served as a valuable source of inspiration for many legal systems in Asia, Africa and Latin America.

Approaching this public law system, this academy provides a carefully curated and comprehensive agenda that features readings, debates, case-studies and structured discussions brought to you by leading academics and practitioners. Topics taught and discussed include:

- the German Constitution's foundation & fundamentals;
- the design, powers, and performance of the Constitutional Court;
- basic rights, including a small moot court;
- various mechanisms and challenges of representative democracy;
- local (self-) governance;
- manifestations of the rule of law from practical perspectives;
- legal methodology, court organization & case management;
- the European perspective;
- Fundamentals of administrative law and procedure; and
- selected future prospects and challenges of the German constitutional state.

The academy combines lecture, classes, and workshop components. Lectures are usually presented by an academic (the course leader or leaders) and are, in general, a listening and note-taking exercise. Classes present an opportunity to work through problem sets or case studies, present papers and discuss them, and to discuss the previous lecture with a class teacher and classmates.

Participants will have early access to pre-recorded lectures and readings which will be followed by live online seminars and discussions. The academy's engaging academic content will be complemented by a range of social opportunities for participants.
